A message from Margaret

Do you have a favourite hymn? Or perhaps like me, you have several favourites for different reasons. Some of mine are from the more traditional hymns that I grew up with whilst others are more modern ones and remind me of particular moments in my life or journey of faith, so to say which is my absolute favourite is more or less impossible.



For the past two or three months, there has been the opportunity for members of the congregation to choose one of the hymns for the communion service and to say why they have chosen it and I have found it fascinating as I have travelled around our parishes to hear the choices made and the reasons given. Some people have given some background to the hymn being written whereas others have spoken of memories it awakens and whilst there have been the occasional duplication, we have sung a fairly wide variety of old and modern hymns.

Whilst some traditions prefer silence in their services, hymns have become an important part of worship for many churches. The psalms, often referred to as “The hymn book of the Old Testament” urges us to sing praise to God. Psalm 100 begins, “Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth,” and psalm 98, “O sing to the Lord a new song, for he has done marvelous things.” Psalm 95, “O come, let us sing to the Lord; let us make a joyful noise to the rock of our salvation,” and this is backed up in the New Testament in Colossians 3 “With gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns and spiritual songs to God,” and Ephesians 5 “Be filled with the Spirit, as you sing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs among yourselves.”

We can sing hymns on our own as well as with others. They can remind us of people or past events. They can bring joy and peace in difficult times and they can be used as a prayer when we are lost for words.

The opportunity to choose a hymn is continuing for the present time and there are spaces on the list in church, so do add your favourite – or one of them – and tell us why. It would be good if we could also learn some new ones so that we can continue to sing a variety of hymns and spiritual songs to God and who knows some of the new ones may well become our favourites for the future.

Alison and Kath from the Wildlife Trust visited our churchyard at the end of July to assess whether we are eligible for the Bronze Award in the Churchyard Conservation Scheme. One of their recommendations was that the wildflower area near the South door should get its annual mow in late summer but that the shaded area, behind Jesus Hospital, would be mainly left as shelter for small creatures in the winter. We will be invited to the award ceremony on 20th October and will get their report then, so fingers crossed.

Two recent additions to the area are a bird bath and a new hedgehog house.

The Season Of Creation

As we enter the month of September, many churches will spend some time focusing on the wonders of creation, with Harvest Festivals or other types of service. For some time now, the Church of England has named the period between 1st September and 4th October as Creationtide, or the Season of Creation, where we can give thanks to God for his gift to us in creation. It was good to witness an uplifting in the recent meeting of General Synod, where further liturgical resources were discussed.



As well as giving thanks to God, this period of time provides us with an opportunity to recommit ourselves to care for all that God has made. As a Diocese, we share in the commitment of the Church of England to become net carbon zero by 2030, an ambitious target, but one that is very important, and reminds us of the fifth Mark of Mission, ‘to strive to safeguard the integrity of creation, and sustain and renew the life of the earth’. Maybe this is a month when you might like to think afresh about you can do to help reach the target.

I am so encouraged to hear of churches that are engaging with Eco Church and delight that we now have some ‘gold churches’ amongst us. What an example they are! Amongst the resources for Creationtide on the Church of England website, I came across this beautiful passage:

In every acorn
there is the potential for a forest;
In every apple pip
there is the potential for an orchard;
In every soul
there is the potential for your kingdom
to be established;
full of joy and peace and love.
Lord, may your kingdom come
in us and in all your creation.

Point to Ponder

Nothing brings us down to earth more quickly than adversity. Illness, accident, sudden bereavement, unforeseen events and so on can throw us into a state of turmoil and fear. We cannot cope with this on our own.

It is often said that we know who our loyal friends are when trouble comes our way. They are the ones who will try to cope with us when we no longer appear to be ourselves. There is often anger in us that emerges when we come face to face with this new experience. This is a sign of love for those who are hurt.

There is also a hatred at the unfairness of what we are going through which is a natural reaction to the mystery of life. Being faced with our own mortality can also evoke a tenderness towards others in the complexities of grief.

The sign of a close community is not just how it treats the dead and the suffering but how it cares for the living and the injured. Those of us who enjoy the company of family and friends cannot escape the pain of adversity as we go about our daily lives nor can we ignore communal grief.

What can be disturbing to any of us is how some people want to use another's tragedy as an excuse to cause community strife, upheaval, and will even search around for "scapegoats." There have been some dreadful situations recently when whole communities have been torn apart and irreplaceable damage has been wrecked on property by people who firmly believe that blatant racism, ignorance, and bigotry should be the order of the day.

Our local communities are not war zones to be ill used by those who love to seek for trouble. Whatever the reasons people may give to justify

their actions we do well to remember the words of Jesus “he that is without sin cast the first stone.” (John 8 verse 7)

Those who are grieving will find no comfort in revenge or consolation in denying people their dignity. We need to also remember the humanity of those who uphold the law as they have loved ones also. Grief should bring out the best in our human nature not the worst scenario.

None of us can escape from our TV news broadcasts the appalling scenes from the Gaza-Israel conflict, the war-torn destruction in the Ukraine and the Sudan and the effects of climate change in many parts of the world.

Grief and loss are no respecter of persons and the calls upon our generosity are never ending. The relief agencies are there to answer the countless calls for help that we cannot meet. As St Paul reminds us that whoever we are, “do not become overcome by evil but overcome evil with good.” (Romans 12:21)

We need to ask ourselves should we be faced with tragedy, do we have to fight it with hatred or with love?

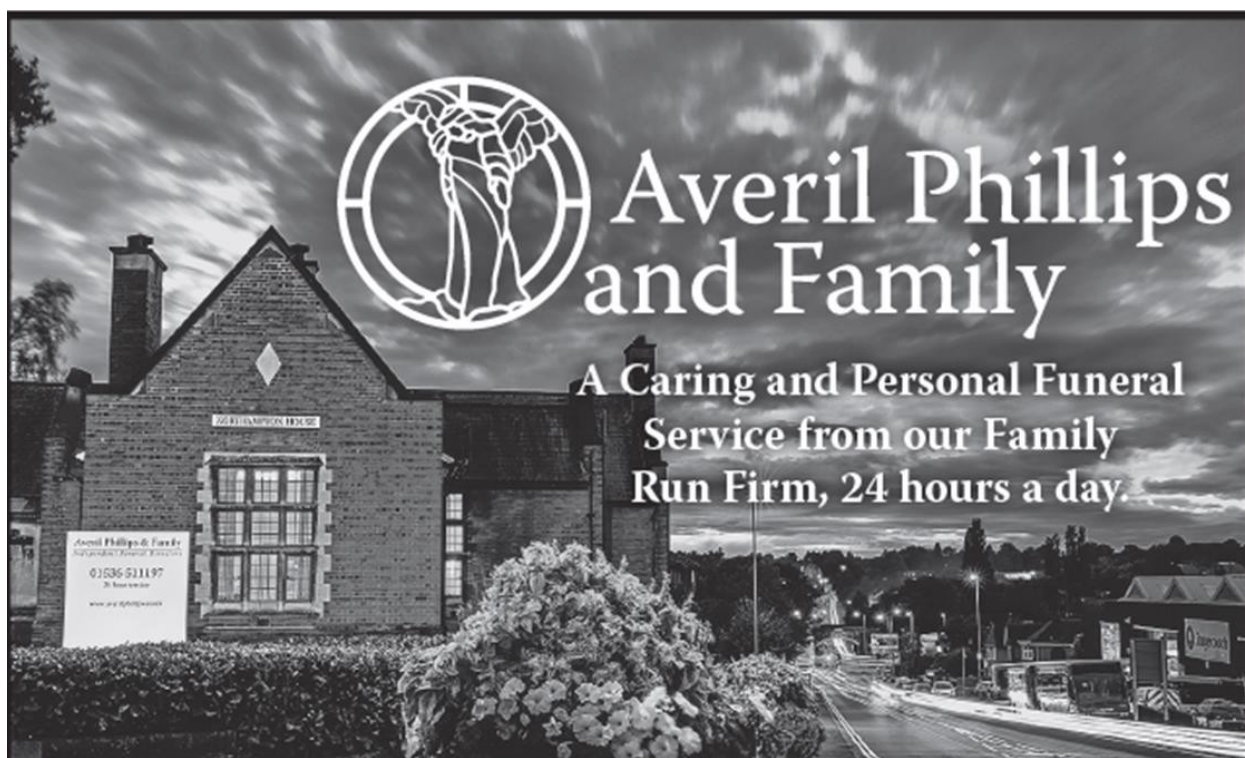
