





#### VJ DAY 80 RUSHTON


I was very happy that so many of us were able to get together to commemorate VJ Day.

## Rushton Public Footpath Improvements

Dear, Rushton Parishioners.

I trust that you have enjoyed the good weather we have had this year and let's hope there is more to come. I am sure many of you will have made use of the public food paths and bridle ways in our parish. If you have, I am sure you will have used the new kissing gates.

Following a suggestion by one of our parishioners and the supporting feedback from others the Parish Council applied for funding to replace the old existing stiles with new Kissing gates.

These new gates now allow greater accessibility to dog walkers, persons who may have difficulty in climbing the traditional types of stiles due to age or disability and provide easy access for families with younger children.

The new gates provide greater access to the countryside for those who currently would not normally benefit from these facilities improving both physical and mental health.

This type of gate will also ensure that livestock cannot pass between areas as they cannot inadvertently be left open. To improve awareness of the actual public footpath route clear directional signage and local signs have been installed encouraging people to follow the country code.

This project was funded by the New Albion Windfarm Fund through Northamptonshire Community Foundation.

This project is now completed, and the Parish Council are required to complete an end of grant report, this is where you can help by providing feedback positive or negative on this project.

#### **THOUGHT FOR THE MONTH**

Do you have a favourite hymn? Or perhaps like me, you have several favourites for different reasons. Some of mine are from the more traditional hymns that I grew up with whilst others are more modern ones and remind me of particular moments in my life or journey of faith, so to say which is my absolute favourite is more or less impossible.

For the past two or three months, there has been the opportunity for members of the congregation to choose one of the hymns for the communion service and to say why they have chosen it and I have found it fascinating as I have travelled around our parishes to hear the choices made and the reasons given. Some people have given some background to the hymn being written whereas others have spoken of memories it awakens and whilst there has been the occasional duplication, we have sung a fairly wide variety of old and modern hymns.

Whilst some traditions prefer silence in their services, hymns have become an important part of worship for many churches. The psalms, often referred to as "The hymn book of the Old Testament" urges us to sing praise to God. Psalm 100 begins, "Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth," and psalm 98, "O sing to the Lord a new song, for he has done marvellous things." Psalm 95, "O come, let us sing to the Lord; let us make a joyful noise to the rock of our salvation," and this is backed up in the New Testament in Colossians 3 "With gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns and spiritual songs to God," and Ephesians 5 "Be filled with the Spirit, as you sing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs among yourselves."

The opportunity to choose a hymn is continuing for the present time and there are spaces on the list in church, so do add your favourite – or one of them – and tell us why. It would be good if we could also learn some new ones so that we can continue to sing a variety of hymns and spiritual songs to God and who knows some of the new ones may well become our favourites for the future.

#### **RUSHTON POCKET PARK**

We are entering the season of "mists and mellow fruitfulness". Here is just some of the natural bounty on offer in the Pocket Park. It will provide sustenance for many of the birds, mammals and insects as other food becomes harder to find.



#### Rushton Parish Radar Speed Sign Update

Six years ago, Rushton Parish Council purchased and installed three Radar Speed Signs. These units where installed in three locations recommended by NNC Highways. 1- Station Road Rushton (Outside the School), 2- Desborough Road Rushton, 3- Oakley Road Pipewell.

These units indicate to approaching drivers their speed on a display board. The speed is displayed in green when drivers are within the speed limit and red when in excess of speed limit acting as a deterrent to slow vehicles down and reminding the drivers of the speed limit. These units also record the speeds of vehicles in either direction, this information is regularly downloaded and stored. The collected data provides the Parish Council with an overview of the numbers of vehicles passing the camera units in both directions, the speeds, dates and times. The Parish Council continues to provide this information to the police to identify areas that require additional speed enforcement.

One area in Rushton Village that is not covered by these speed cameras is the West section of Station Road from Desborough Road to the Junction of High Street at Thornhill Arms. Many Parishioners have reported their concerns at the excess speed of vehicles in this section of road particularly approaching the junction where the road narrows and there are parked cars.

A survey to review the RSS positions was undertaken by NNC Highways road safety officer, and it was recommended to relocate the existing camera in Station Road to the High Street junction to record the speeds of approaching vehicles and attempt to slow down speeding vehicles.

From the information recorded on the Station Road RSS (Outside the School) in its location the speeds of the majority of vehicles do not exceed the speed limit, this is due to the two traffic calming speed humps in the that section of road. The excessively high speeds recorded tend to be during the night time hours.

A new camera mounting post has been installed in an optimum position to capture approaching vehicles towards this junction, and the existing RSS unit ( Outside the school) has now been relocated to the new mounting post, set up and adjusted.

The RSS located in Oakley Road Pipewell had been stolen and a successful insurance was made for the replacement unit. To reduce the chance of this unit being stolen again a fabricated cover plate which will be secured with security bolts protecting the vulnerable standard supplied fixings has been fitted.





Rushton Parish Council received a grant for Northampton Community Foundation to fund the original RSS units and have now received a further small grant to:

- To supply and install a new RSS mounting post (in the new position)
- Relocation of RSS equipment
- Installation of new RSS in Pipewell into the existing position
- Fabrication of secure cover plate and secure fixings.
- Update software in laptop and each of existing RSS units & Replace Batteries in existing RSS
  units as they have now exceeded their recommended life of 3 years.



#### **RUSHTON VILLAGE W.I.**

On a very warm August evening, Steve Reid gave a talk about setting up, developing and expanding his business. When he left his full time job in 2019, he was primarily working in hospitality. Of course, this changed significantly during lockdown, when he began to sell jars of preserves as Friars Farm Chutneys and Preserves.

Several of his recipes have been developed from a very old Northamptonshire WI cookbook, including brown sauce adapted from a recipe for Houses of Parliament Sauce. Did you know that's what HP Sauce stands for?

Steve likes to use local ingredients and local connections. He has recently teamed up with Jeyes of Earls Barton, using a recipe found there, to produce Jeyes Northamptonshire Sauce which is similar to Worcestershire sauce and sells very well.

After starting cheese making for fun, he set up the Northamptonshire Cheese Co. After tasting some of his cheese, we were not surprised to learn that he has won several awards. We sampled Cordwainer, a blue cheese; Toggles, a sort of cross between Lancashire and Wensleydale; and Marmite Clickers, a cheddar with added marmite which was definitely my favourite.

His most recent business venture is the Northamptonshire Charcuterie Co. This is based, along with the others, at Phipps Brewery in Northampton. This is a welcome development for Steve and his partner because their home no longer has the constant smell of chutney cooking, if you have ever made chutney, you will know how pungent it is and how long it lingers.

After a fascinating talk, enhanced by the delicious samples, we had the opportunity to buy some of Steve's products; he didn't take too many home.

Our meeting in September is a pottery workshop with Louise Crookendon-Johnson. I'm really looking forward to it; I love a meeting where I can join in!

I am so glad I joined the WI; I enjoy all the things we do. However, the best thing about it is the friendship and support of such a great group of people. If you would like to give it a try, you are guaranteed someone to chat to. Our superskill is making people very welcome.



#### POINT TO PONDER FOR SEPTEMBER 2025

Nothing brings us down to earth more quickly than adversity. Illness, accident, sudden bereavement, unforeseen events and so on can throw us into a state of turmoil and fear. We cannot cope with this on our own. It is often said that we know who our loyal friends are when trouble comes our way. They are the ones who will try to cope with us when we no longer appear to be ourselves. There is often anger in us that emerges when we come face to face with this new experience. This is a sign of love for those who are hurt. There is also a hatred at the unfairness of what we are going through, which is a natural reaction to the mystery of life. Being faced with our own mortality can also evoke a tenderness towards others in the complexities of grief. The sign of a close community is not just how it treats the dead and the suffering, but how it cares for the living and the injured. Those of us who enjoy the company of family and friends cannot escape the pain of adversity as we go about our daily lives, nor can we ignore communal grief. What can be disturbing to any of us is how some people want to use another's tragedy as an excuse to cause community strife, upheaval, and will even search around for "scapegoats." There have been some dreadful situations recently when whole communities have been torn apart and irreplaceable damage has been wreaked on property by people who firmly believe that blatant racism, ignorance, and bigotry should be the order of the day. Our local communities are not war zones to be ill used by those who love to seek for trouble. Whatever the reasons people may give to justify their actions we do well to remember the words of Jesus "he that is without sin cast the first stone." (John 8 verse 7) Those who are grieving will find no comfort in revenge or consolation in denying people their dignity. We need to also remember the humanity of those who uphold the law as they have loved ones also. Grief should bring out the best in our human nature not the worst scenario. None of us can escape from our TV news' broadcasts the appalling scenes from the Gaza -Israel conflict, the war-torn destruction in the Ukraine and the Sudan and the effects of climate change in many parts of the world. Grief and loss are no respecters of persons and the calls upon our generosity are never ending. The relief agencies are there to answer the countless calls for help that we cannot meet. As St Paul reminds us that whoever we are, "do not become overcome by evil but overcome evil with good." (Romans 12:21) We need to ask ourselves should we be faced with tragedy, do we have to fight it with hatred or with love?
