





Petition to North Northamptonshire Council to Improve Road Safety in the Parish of Rushton

We, the undersigned residents of **Rushton Parish** wish to draw attention to the ongoing road safety challenges that threaten our rural community. These persistent problems present considerable risks to pedestrians, cyclists, equestrians, and motorists, necessitating immediate action from the relevant authorities.

Our concerns are based on the findings of a comprehensive report compiled from residents' feedback, which outlines the present and reported issues affecting Rushton's road network. The aim of this petition is to clearly convey the difficulties we face and to highlight the specific locations and circumstances that require urgent intervention.

Key Issues Identified

Increasing traffic through the Parish:

The volume of vehicles passing through Rushton has grown significantly, leading to diminished safety and adversely impacting residents quality of life.

Speeding Vehicles:

Many drivers are exceeding speed limits throughout the parish, which increases the likelihood of accidents and places all road users at heightened risk.

Severe congestion at school times:

Traffic congestion is especially acute during school opening and closing hours, resulting in increased hazards for children and parents in the vicinity.

Inadequate or poorly sited road signs:

Current road signage is either insufficient in number or poorly positioned, which reduces driver awareness and compromises overall safety.

Overgrown Hedges and Grass Verges:

Neglected hedges and verges restrict visibility for road users, creating additional dangers for motorists, cyclists, and pedestrians alike.

Flooding Due to Inadequate Drainage:

Failure to maintain drainage systems has led to flooding, which further endangers everyone using the roads.

Poor Road Maintenance:

Potholes and uneven surfaces pose serious risks to vehicles, cyclists, and pedestrians, making the roads hazardous to navigate.

Inadequate Street Lighting:

Limited street lighting, particularly in certain areas, increases the probability of accidents during evening hours and at night.

Requests to North Northamptonshire Council

We respectfully urge North Northamptonshire Council to implement the following measures without delay:

1. Introduce strategies to limit the increasing number of vehicles passing through the Parish of Rushton, especially when planning future housing and business developments.
2. Install traffic calming measures such as speed bumps, chicanes, speed cameras, or redefine priorities at road junctions to deter excessive speeding and improve overall safety.
3. Substantially improve road signage and markings to ensure clear guidance and enhanced safety for all road users.
4. Enforce effective measures that prevent poor parking practices, which currently impede road safety.
5. Resolve underlying drainage problems to prevent repeated flooding and the associated risks.
6. Repair and maintain road surfaces so that they meet safe standards for vehicles, cyclists, and pedestrians.
7. Regularly maintain hedgerows and verges to improve visibility and minimise risk to those using the roads.
8. Increase street lighting in inadequately illuminated areas to reduce accidents during evenings and nights.

We also recommend that the Rushton Parish Council engages in regular consultation with local residents to gather feedback on traffic and safety issues, ensuring that community voices are actively considered in future planning decisions. Additionally, the introduction of educational campaigns on road safety could further support these physical measures promoting responsible behaviour among all road


Perhaps you can help.

Rushton Village Hall Installation of Solar Panels

Dear Rushton Parishioners

The Village Hall is delighted to announce the successful installation of its new solar photovoltaic (PV) system. The new system is expected to generate around 71% of the Hall's annual electricity needs, dramatically reducing reliance on grid power and lowering day to day running costs.

At times of strong sunshine, the system will produce more electricity than the Hall can use. This surplus energy will be exported back to the national grid, generating an estimated £800 of additional income each year.

This modern, efficient PV installation will provide clean, renewable electricity throughout the year. By cutting carbon emissions and supplying low carbon energy to the wider grid, it strengthens the Hall's commitment to environmental sustainability while supporting long-term financial resilience.

The project represents a significant investment in the future of the Village Hall, helping to secure its ability to continue offering valued services, activities, and facilities for the whole community.

This project was funded by the New Albion Windfarm Fund through Northamptonshire Community Foundation.

POINT TO PONDER FOR FEBRUARY 2026

“From Greenland’s icy mountains from India’s coral strand.” These are not the opening words of a policy document on colonial expansion! They are the first lines of a hymn by Bishop Reginald Heber (1783 - 1826) on the mission of the Christian Church to spread the good news of God’s love to every corner of the world.

Although, we live in a different world today from that of Heber, we still need to hear the timeless message of what it means to have a loving God in our hearts and the love of neighbour in our daily lives. There is also the divine expectation “that nation shall not lift up a sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any-more.” (Micah 4:4) Most religions are not confined by national boundaries. The last few months and years have brought to our TV screens the reality of the power of evil which lies behind the greed and violence threatening not only Greenland, but anywhere in the world. Bishop Heber was very pro the beauty and love that brought the world into being which was reflected in many of his hymns and in his open generous nature. However, he also coined that damning verdict on evil contained in his words in the previously quoted hymn, “and only man is vile.” The good Bishop was well travelled in his formative years throughout Europe and eventually became Bishop of Kolkata, (Calcutta). He encountered a very divided and diverse world but he was also perceptive in discovering that there is no power on earth that can threaten our existence other than that which lies within ourselves and our disobedience to God’s will. It is easy to look for others to blame when things go wrong, but we also need to admit that we can all make mistakes. Admitting our frailty can be the first step in having a change of direction in the way we live, and finding our footsteps in creating a more graceful and joyful existence. What is true of individuals is also true of nations and political ideologies. Some of those who grab the headlines today are doing us a favour in reminding us that we do not have to follow their examples to attain happiness and wellbeing. Do we honestly think that greed will encourage generosity, and bullying support for the downtrodden? Can real peace and prosperity be achieved by bombs and bullets? There needs to be a radical change in everyone’s heart if we would build human life, wellbeing, and prosperity for everyone. There is nothing contrary in human nature in regarding one another as bundles of potential energy, well-being, and opportunities for goodness. We were not created to be vile but loving. As James Baldwin (1924-1987), the American writer reminds us, “we cannot deny the humanity of another without diminishing one’s own.” Jesus teaches us (Mark 8:37)” what does a man profit if he gains the whole world but loses his own soul”?
